Dodgeball tournament exceeds expectations

The first ever Dalhart Dodgeball Tournament surpassed their fundraising goal for the inaugural event, and organizers are looking forward to continuing the tournament annually.

"What I love is that there were so many different businesses and people in the community. It was awesome to see people in the community come together and have fun," Sarah Vyn said.

There were 34 spots available for teams to register, and organizers filled 18 of those.

"It went really well. Originally, we wanted 34 teams, and we ended up with 18 teams. For a first event, I think it was great to have the teams we did," Vyn said.

The tournament was organized as a fundraiser for an upcoming educational trip for the junior high students at Dalhart Christian Academy. The students plan to travel to Washington D.C. in May, and Vyn said the goal is to have an educational trip each school year for the junior high students.

"The parents got together to discuss fundraising ideas. The idea of dodgeball came to me. I grew up in Canada, and my brother was diagnosed with cancer. A group got together to raise money for him," Vyn said.

That event was so successful it inspired Vyn to create a similar event in Dalhart.

"I thought, let's do something different for Dalhart," she said.

Finding comfort in times of grief

A group of women gather around a table in Dalhart Prayer House, opening their twice monthly support group with the Serenity Prayer. The women, ranging in age from 48 to 90, all share a common story. Each has lost a spouse.

"We start with the serenity prayer because it gives a reminder for us that there are some things you can't change, because God knows if we could, we would," Jamie Gillispie, social worker with Coon Memorial Home Health and Hospice, said.

Gillispie is the facilitator of the group, which officially began meeting in October. While the core group of women who meet have all lost a spouse, the bereavement group is for anyone who is grieving, no matter their gender or who they lost.

"Most of our group has been people that have lost a spouse. A time or two we have had someone come that had lost a parent. It can be anything. Any loss is significant. But, I think it's been good for us that commonality has been there," Gillispie said.

While the group is sponsored by Coon Memorial Home Health and Hospice, it is not only for those who have utilized the services of the local hospice. The women who meet regularly travel as far as 70 miles to







participate.

"It doesn't matter how long it's been or how recent. If you're grieving or still have bereavement issues or feel a group would be beneficial," she said the group is meant for anyone who has a need.

Application. XIT Concrete, Inc., has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration No. 150288L002, which would authorize construction of a temporary concrete batch plant located at 13401 U.S. Highway 385, Dalhart, Dallam County, Texas 79022. This link to an electronic map of the site or facility's general location is provided as a public courtesy and not part of the application or notice. For exact location, refer to application. http://www.tceq.texas.gov/assets/public/hb610/index.html?lat=36.239444&lng= 102.532778&zoom=13&type=r. The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants: particulate matter including (but not limited to) aggregate, cement, road dust, and particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on February 5, 2019. The executive director has completed the administrative and technical reviews of the application and determined that the application meets all of the requirements of a standard permit authorized by 30 TAC § 116.611, which would establish the conditions under which the plant must operate. The executive director has made a preliminary decision to issue the registration because it meets all applicable rules. The application, executive director's preliminary decision, and standard permit will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Amarillo regional office, and the Dallam Hartley County Library, 420 Denrock Avenue, Dalhart, Dallam County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review at the TCEQ Amarillo Regional Office, 3918 Canyon Dr, Amarillo, Texas. Visit www.tceq.texas. gov/goto/cbp to review the standard permit.

Public Comment/Public Meeting. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting. See Contacts section. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments or meeting requests is 30 days after newspaper notice is published. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to consider in the permit process.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing. If a public meeting is held, the deadline to submit public comments is extended to the end of the public meeting.

Contested Case Hearing. You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. To request a hearing, a person must actually reside in a permanent residence within 440 yards of the proposed plant. 





Lady Wolves take second place at Wildcat Relays

For the second straight week, the Dalhart Lady Wolves took second place in a track meet as they scored a total of 160 points at the Wildcat Relays at River Road High School. They were just 15 points behind Caprock High, a Class 5A school, and beat district rival Pampa by 35 points.

In the 100-meter dash, Caryce Guerrero placed second with a time of 12.59 seconds. In the 200-meter dash, Dalhart took three of the top six places. Kaeona Marquez placed third at 28.29 seconds, Bethany Berngen placed fifth at 29.02 seconds, and Madison Todd placed sixth at 29.15 seconds.

Bailey Dettle placed in the top four in both the 400-meter dash and the 800-meter run. Dettle took fourth place in the 400 with a time of 1 minutes 8.21 seconds and placed second in the 800 with a time of 2 minutes 45.73 seconds.

Maly Delgado won first place in the 3200-meter run with a time of 12 minutes 44.64 seconds and Valeria Vasquez placed fifth at 14 minutes 1.60 seconds. In the 1600-meter run, Delgado placed second at 5 minutes 48.88 seconds.

In the 100-meter hurdles, Ashley Amico placed second at 17.30 Rutherford placed sixth at 18.36 seconds. In the 300-meter hurdles, 22.

Rutherford placed third at 52.42 seconds.

The team of Madison Todd, Amico, Marquez and Berngen won first place in the 800-meter relay with a time of 1 minute 50.82 seconds, with Berngen just barely crossing the finish line ahead of Bethany Roden of Pampa. In the 400-meter relay, the team of Madison Todd, Marquez, Loree Simmons and Amico placed second with a time of 52.52 seconds.

In the long jump, Marquez placed second with a jump of 16 feet 2.5 inches and Madison Todd placed sixth with a jump of 15 feet 1.5 inches. In the triple jump, Rutherford placed fourth with a jump of 32 feet 7 inches. In the high jump, Ali Hickey placed third with a jump of 4 feet 10 inches.

Dalhart took two of the top three places in the shot put. Cristal Davila placed second with a throw of 32 feet 6 inches and Natalie Olvera, competing in her first meet of the year after finishing powerlifting, placed third with a throw of 30 feet 8.5 inches. In the discus, Olvera placed second with a throw of 85 feet 8 inches.

The Lady Wolves took three of the top six places in the pole vault in very windy conditions. Amico won first place with a vault of 10 feet 9 inches, setting a new personal record. Rhiana Todd placed third with a vault of eight feet six inches, and Hanna Wilkerson placed sixth with a vault of seven feet six inches.





Aguilera places third, Olvera fourth at regional powerlifting That was an increase of 15 pounds over Jameson cleared 490 in the squat, 275

Nine members of the Dalhart Golden Wolves' powerlifting team competed at the regional meet in Sundown last Friday, March 8. Five of them placed in the top ten in their respective weight classes, while four ended up "bombing out," which means they were unable to complete a lift in one of the three categories of lifts and were therefore disqualified.

Anthony Aguilera placed third for Dalhart in the 198 lb. class, lifting a total of 1,295 pounds. Aguilera cleared 465 pounds in the squat, 315 pounds in the bench press, and 515 pounds in the deadlift. his previous high at the meet in Borger. Aguilera improved by an impressive 185 pounds from his first meet of the season.
